The Actorsingers
In June 1955 a group of children and adults under the direction of James Wood performed in Gilbert & Sullivan's "The Mikado". From this beginning grew the idea for the present organization known as the Actorsingers. The Actorsingers made their debut in Nashua in January, 1956, when they presented "The Bohemian Girl" by Balfe. Since then they have done two shows a year, presenting works by Menotti, Gilbert & Sullivan, Victor Herbert, Planquette, Offenbach, Davis, Strauss, in addition to which the group has also performed in medieval morality plays, scored a great success in Matthew's Christmas Cantata in December, 1962, and received a standing ovation for its performance in "Little Mary Sunshine" by Rick Besoyan. From its inception the Actorsingers organization has presented to the people of Nashua good entertainment of a musical-dramatic nature. It offers members of the community a medium of expression for their individual talents, whether it is performing on stage, or costume designing, set designing, choreography, make-up, and the many attendant technical and manual skills that are so vital in making a show a success. The name "Actorsingers" was adopted as most aptly describing the double challenge of presenting shows which bring to Nashua the wonderful combination of good music and acting. The group is a non-profit, non-denominational organization incorporated in June of 1961 with by-laws governing its policies. The Executive Board meets once a month. The Junior Actorsingers, an offspring of the parent group, made up of children of the Actorsingers and patrons, from 7 to 12 years of age, present an operetta in February of each year.
