IN THE SPOTLIGHT

CHARLES KOWALSKI — Joined Actorsingers in 1966. Has served on the Board of Directors for Actorsingers and is presently serving as President. Played "Lt. Buzz Adams" and was a member of the chorus in "South Pacific". Played the title role of Frank Butler in "Annie Get Your Gun" in May 1967, however, will best be remembered as "Sky Masterson" in last Spring's production of "Guys & Dolls". Charlie took on a big job for "Show Boat" but did it well.

CLAIRE ANDERSON — Joined Actorsingers in 1962 — Active member of the Congregational Church Choir, Christ The King Lutheran Church Choir, and the American Legion Chorus. Has performed with the Amherst PTA Players and The Nashua Theatre Guild. Has served as recording secretary of the Actorsingers and director of the Junior Actorsingers. This is Claire's 1st major role with the Actorsingers.

MILES CARES — Joined Actorsingers in the fall of 1967. Is best remembered for his role as "General Birabeau" in "The Desert Song", and as "Harry-the-Horse" in last Spring's production of "Guys & Dolls". Is active in politics in the Pelham area and has directed several school plays.

IRENE JEFFERSON — Joined Actorsingers in "Desert Song". Appeared in Shirley Players production of "Teahouse of the August Moon". Irene studied one year at Connecticut School of Music and New England Conservatory of Music in Boston.

FRANK HARVEY — Joined Actorsingers in the comedy musical "Little Mary Sunshine" to portray "Captain Big Jim Warrington". Next appeared in "Kiss Me Kate" as the dynamic "Petruccio", however Frank will best be remembered for his role as "Emile De Becque" in "South Pacific". A Nashua area soloist, Frank is also a member of "The Choraliers".

ANNE S. MANOUSOS — This is Anne's first appearance in The Actorsingers. She is a member and assistant-director of "The Choraliers", as well as being on the board of directors for Concerts for Young People, Inc. Anne has taught music in the Nashua School system, studied voice at Rivier College in Nashua and has had two radio programs, one in Mass. and one in N. H. At present is a music teacher in the Chelmsford School system, teaching over closed-circuit television.

JOHN CORTESE — John comes to Actorsingers via New York City and has resided in Nashua for one year. Has had an extensive music background in the New York area. Came to us through a friend, hope you like us John as much as we enjoy having you as part of our group.

JANICE ROCKWELL — Janice appeared in last Spring's production of "Guys & Dolls" as a dancer and member of the Chorus. Has studied modern dance under Arlene Ashton, was a member of the Beverly Church Choir, and singing trio "The Startimers". This is her first major role with the Actorsingers.

ERNEST FERNANDEZ — Ernie is an all-around member of the Actorsingers serving both behind-the-scenes as well as in front of the lights. Has appeared in the male chorus of "Desert Song" and "Guys & Dolls" and also danced in both "Annie Get Your Gun" and "South Pacific". Has also contributed his talents to the Nashua Theatre Guild. This is his first major role for the Actorsingers.

LINDA BRIGGS — "Showboat" is Linda's first appearance with the Actorsingers. Attended Harriet Beecher Stowe College, Eastern Nazarene College where she studied voice and music theory. Has previously acted in High School productions.

HOWARD NUNN, JR. — A new member of Actorsingers with this production. Has sung semi-professional with the "Four Roses" for four years. Has also sung with the "Stars of Zion". Howard is currently with the soul group "The Salutations" of Lowell.

STEVE NORRIS — A graduate of Boston University with a BA degree in music and is presently Musical Director in the Nashua School System. Has provided the musical direction for the past five shows for the Actorsingers, "Kiss Me Kate", "South Pacific", "Annie Get Your Gun", "Desert Song", and last Spring's production of "Guys & Dolls". We are pleased to again have him as Musical Director of "Show Boat".

CAROL FARLAND — The Theatre is Carol's first love and as Dramatics Director for "Show Boat", Carol brings forth her many talents which speak for herself. Has directed several one and three act plays, as well as two amateur shows. Has special training in directing and stage lighting as well as costumes, programs, staging etc. Welcome to the Actorsingers Carol.

MARGARET TAMULONIS — What would Actorsingers do without Penny, for whenever there is work to be done Penny is not far away. Penny joined Actorsingers in "Iolanthe", appeared in the chorus of Sweethearts in "New Moon", as Jane Ashton in "Brigadoon", Dolly in "Annie Get Your Gun", and has appeared in state competitive plays performed by the Nashua Women's Club. If Penny is not on stage you will usually find her with needle and thread in hand.

VIRGINIA MAMMONE — Ginny studied tap, ballet, and toe dancing with Priscilla Baker in New York for 10 years. Joined the Actorsingers in August 1967, and has appeared in "Desert Song" and "Guys & Dolls" in both chorus and dance routines and has also designed posters and programs for both. This is Ginny's first attempt at Choreography for the Actorsingers. Her talents are many.

JO MILLET — A well known Nashua area organist and music teacher. Jo has been accompanist for the Actorsingers for many years. Most recently accompanied "The Creation" performance and The Interfaith Choir Concert. Jo attended the Fealton Conservatory of Music and has a B. M. degree in music from Boston University. Has also provided the musical accompaniment for several "Christopher Players" productions. Your unselfish devotion to Actorsingers will always be appreciated Jo.

The Actorsingers

The present organization of Actorsingers made its debut as a performing group in January 1955, when its members presented "The Bohemian Girl" by Balfe. Since that time they have performed on an average of twice a year, demonstrating their versatility by running the scale from Gilbert & Sullivan to nostalgic Victor Herbert and Strauss shows, from modern Menotti works to Besoyan's "Little Mary Sunshine", when their performance was accorded a standing ovation. In response to popular request, they have gone on to "big time" musicals with successful presentations of "Brigadoon", "Kiss Me Kate", "South Pacific", "Annie Get Your Gun", "Desert Song" and last spring's production of "Guys and Dolls".

Since 1955, the Actorsingers have offered to the citizens of Nashua and surrounding communities good entertainment of a musical-dramatic nature. Its ever-swelling membership has an opportunity to express and develop individual talents in stage performance, costume designing and construction, choreography, make-up and many attendant technical skills so vital to a show's success.

The name "Actorsingers" was adopted as most descriptive of the double challenge of bringing to Nashua productions requiring good musicianship and acting.

The group is a non-profit, non-denominational organization incorporated in June, 1961, and is governed by a set of by-laws and its Executive Board which meets once a month. There are no dues required for membership.

The Junior Actorsingers, an off-spring of the parent group, is made up of children of the Actorsingers and patrons. These youngsters, ranging from 7 to 12 years of age, perform in an operetta in the springtime of each year.
