NASHUA CHORAL SOCIETY

THE NASHUA CHORAL SOCIETY, a member of the Nashua Symphony Association, is an organization whose members enjoy singing classical music. The group had its inception in the early sixties under the direction of Martin Fischer.

The group has recently returned from a very successful concert tour in England which was highlighted by a final concert in Gloucester Cathedral. The Society's next concert will include <u>Fanfares</u> by the contemporary Boston composer, Daniel Pinkham, and <u>Christmas Carols</u> by the young English composer, John Rutter, as well as the ever popular Messiah, by Handel.

The Choral Society is under the direction of James Johnston, a Nashua native, who is also the Minister of Music at First Church.



THE CHRISTOPHER SINGERS

THE CHRISTOPHER SINGERS were organized in 1968 to provide music for the weekly St. Christopher's Church folk-mass.

Since their beginning they have performed for numerous church, service clubs and organizations. During the past three years, the Christopher Singers have performed two full-length concerts, participated in the Multiple Sclerosis Foundation Benefit Variety Show and have recorded a full-length record album in Boston, (Currently available in the Nashua area.)

Their repertoire includes a wide variety of folk and pop selections which represents some of the best written songs of the past and present. Each member has performed individually, however at present the Christopher Singers are planning a number of other appearances for this year and will still continue to play and sing in their own church.

NASHUA THEATRE GUILD was formed in 1961. During these 15 years, forty five plays have been produced, ranging from farce to melodrama, comedy to tragedy. Children's plays have been presented - either produced alone or as a traveling show in joint sponsorship with T. R. Y.

In recent years, an evening of one acts have been presented and the one act play deemed most suitable has been chosen to compete in the N.H.C.T.A. drama festival. Awards for best costume, best set, and best actress have been received by N.T.G.

"SHOWSTOPPERS", a singing and dancing group of twelve youngsters ranging from ages 6 - 12, was organized three years ago to perform for a Parent's Night program at Fairgrounds Elementary School. Since that beginning, they have participated in the Christmas and Spring Musical Programs at the school, and received a standing ovation for their selections from the musical "Fiddler On The Roof". The Showstoppers are a group of Fairgrounds students directed by their music teacher, Mrs. Nancy Borski. Their successful performance during the schools Bicentennial Show last May led to the request for them to perform at the Actorsingers Building Fund Benefit Show.

Accompanying the Showstoppers will be the well-known Nashua accompanist, Mrs. Everett (Jo) Millett. George Pelletier, a 7th grade student at Fairgrounds Junior High will provide the rhythm to keep the Showstoppers stepping.

The trio has been together for three years performing for various service clubs and organizations in the Nashua area.



ACTORSINGERS

To capsulize over twenty years of music from Operettas and musical comedies is almost an impossibility. We have selected music from productions that have contributed to the growth of the organization known as "The Actorsingers".

In 1955, "The Mikado" was the first operetta offered to the people of Nashua. Directed musically and dramatically by a single choir director and performed on the small stage of the auditorium in the Church of the Good Shepherd.

With the lively "Naughty Marietta", one year later, we lost our "Shirt" but with contributions from many Actorsingers and an unknown benefactor we were solvent again.

"Brigadoon" was the turning point in the growth of Actorsingers. We held public auditions, involved interested directors and moved to the Fairgrounds Elementary School Auditorium for our shows, and increased our accompanists to two pianos and a "Piper".

"South Pacific" found the Actorsingers performing in the EIm Street Auditorium, accompanied by a full orchestra. The production of "Mame" was our entrance to current "big time" musicals and was so well received by the Nashua audience that we decided to present more of the same.

From our last production, "Carousel" we will present our speciality dancers, a long step from the early non-moving operettas. We have included in our program the beautiful and truly expressive "Climb Every Mountain" from "The Sound of Music"; for we feel that Actorsingers has climbed and is still climbing the musical mountain with our local talent and the presence of an ever-increasing appreciative audience. For the Actorsingers of Nashua, we feel there is no business like show business and it is our aim to continue to bring to our audience the best musicals we can produce. For us, it is not "An Impossible Dream".
