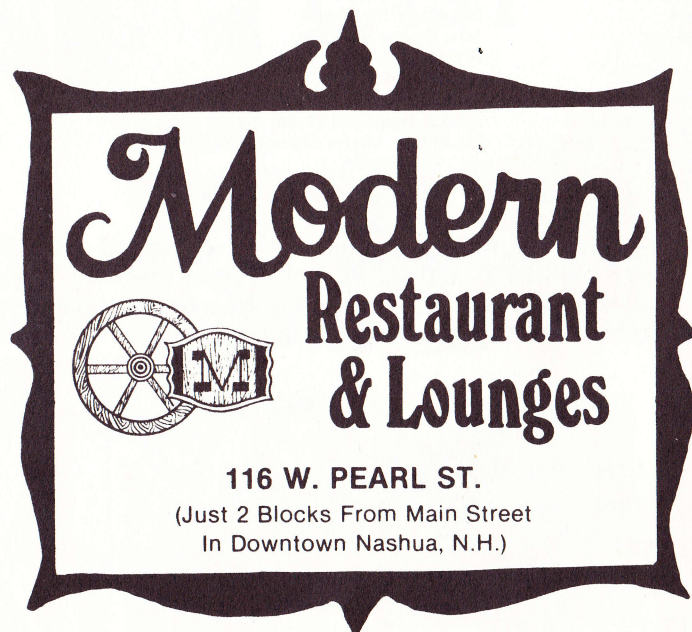

#### Director

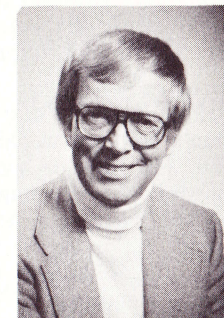

#### Stage Manager

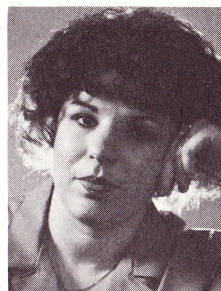

Rose

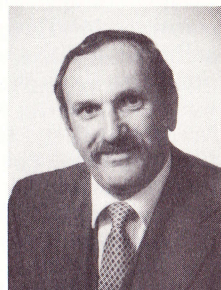

Herbie

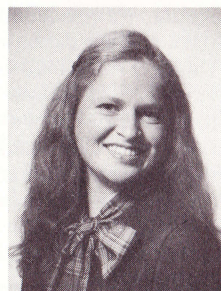

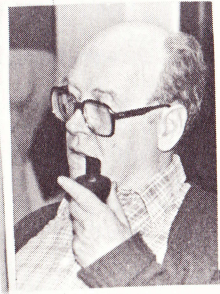
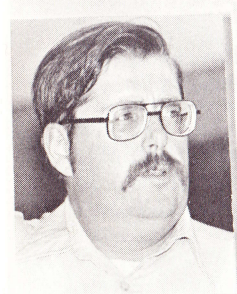
