

Kevin McDonough Prince Dauntless

Kevin is a theatre major at the University of New Hampshire and has performed a variety of roles in productions of "Oedipus", "The Mikado", "Russian Nights", and others. He is professionally employed with "Little Red Wagon", a touring children's theatre company. A 1972 graduate of Nashua High School, Kevin has a year and a half to go at UNH for his BA in Theatre, after which he would like to pursue a career in the theatre.

Stan Polan King Sextimus

Stan currently serves as Vice President of Actorsingers and is a two-term past Treasurer. However, he is no stranger to "the boards", having appeared as Merlin in "Camelot", Mr. Applegate in "Damn Yankees" and several supporting roles. With two children who share his love of theatre, you usually see Stan actively involved with the Junior Actorsingers in one capacity or another.

Linda's is a familiar name to those involved in area community theatre. 
