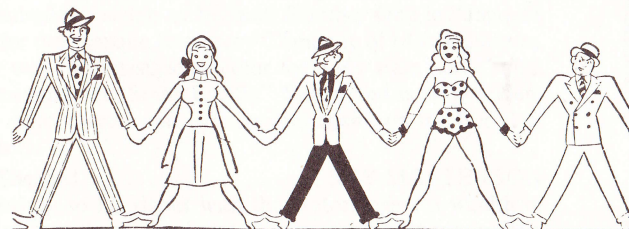

Robert Narkunas MUSICAL DIRECTOR

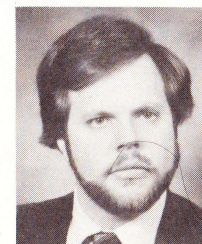
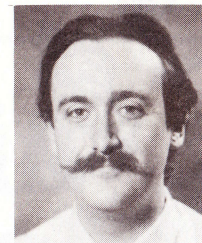

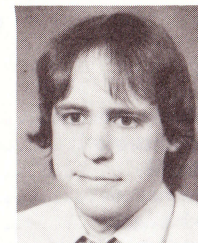
Julia Breveleri . . . GENERAL CARTWRIGHT
