

One year ago, Sal was our music director for GREASE and appeared with our on-stage band. Sal holds a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from the New England Conservatory and a Master's from the University of New Hampshire. Not only does Sal work with high schools and community theatre groups, but he has directed productions including THE FANTASTICKS and JACQUES BREL for the American Stage Festival and the Charles Playhouse in Boston. Among others, he's directed OLIVER!, MY FAIR LADY and SOUTH PACIFIC. Sal is a member of the Tanglewood Festival Chorus. He teaches here in Nashua on the staff in the music department at Pennichuck Jr. High and is their chorus director.

CHOREOGRAPHER LESLIE GLOW JARVIS

In ANYTHING GOES last fall, Leslie was both a dancer and our Assistant Choreographer. She has been an active Actorsinger member since 1986 and was seen in shows including WEST SIDE STORY, MACK AND MABEL and GREASE. Before working with us, Leslie appeared in DAMN YANKEES, KISS ME KATE and CABARET. She has taught aerobics for the Phys. Ed. department at U.N.H. and has now been instructing for Harte-Hanks Data Technologies for over 3 years, where she has a technical career. Leslie also has a music background. She plays the piano and the drums. Leslie studies ballet and tap at The Dancing Corner in Nashua. In her "spare time", she and her husband, David, are a D.J. team called Party Sound.

PRODUCTION COORDINATOR. CARRIE BELANGER-PELCHAT

Carrie is well qualified in this position having worked both backstage and on-stage. Her most recent role was with Londonderry's Mad Co. as Nancy in OLIVER. Carrie has been in several of our shows including last year's production of GREASE in which she played Betty Rizzo. She is a featured singer and trumpet player with the American Legion Band in Hudson. Carrie has travelled extensively with them and says that God, Bless America is her most requested song from coast to coast. She and her husband, Kevin, have both been active members since 1983. They have 2 children; Wendy, age 6 and Danny, age 3.

STAGE MANAGER KATHY LOVERING

Kathy's last project was with her husband, Bob - daughter, Madeline - born in December. She very much enjoys her time with the new baby and their other daughter, Emily. Kathy's last Actorsinger position was as the Set Designer of ANYTHING GOES. She has been Stage Manager/Set Designer for many of our shows including HELLO, DOLLY, THE WIZ, THE MUSIC MAN, PETER PAN and GREASE. For this and other backstage work, she was a recipient of our Penny Award. In addition to her very strong production background, Kathy has appeared on our stage several times and has held the offices of President, Vice-President and Secretary. She has also worked for First Church, U.C.C. writing and directing shows.

SET DESIGNER JAMES A. TRAVERS

We welcome James to his first Actorsinger project. James now lives in Manchester but is from Ohio. There he received his degree in Commercial Art from the University of Akron and studied film at Kent State. In all, James has spent 17 years in art and film. He has worked with several well-known interior designers, and has done murals and canvases, both private and commercial. James feels that his set is a character just as the actors on stage are. He knows that audience involvement lends to the feeling of a show, and with that in mind, James has designed the sets as though the audience is the sun.

LIGHTING DESIGNERS DENNIS SCHNEIDER JOHN MCALLISTER

Dennis estimates that he has done 50 productions in his 18 years of lighting design and special effects. For the Actorsingers, he designed shows including THE SOUND OF MUSIC, OLIVER!, WEST SIDE STORY and MACK AND MABEL. Dennis was responsible for the explosives set off in THE WIZ and with the use of a lazer in PETER PAN, he created Tinkerbell. Dennis is employed by Digital where his title reads U.S. Sales Manager. He, his wife Kerry, and their children, Brian and Lauren, are active Actorsinger members.

John, and his wife, Linnea have been members of the Actorsingers for a number of years. In that time, John has taken on many projects, both backstage and in the administrative department. Although he doesn't appear on stage, John is important to each production. He has helped the on the stage crew, as Set Designer, Stage Manager and as a Lighting Designer. John has held positions on the Board of Directors and is a former President. He and Linnea live in Hollis and have a son, Jeffrey.

COSTUME DESIGNER . . . MARGARET "PENNY" TAMULONIS

By profession, an early-childhood teacher. By inclination, an Actorsinger - since 1957. Penny appeared as Discression in the mortality play, EVERYMAN. She has been Costume Designer or consultant for many shows, beginning with IOLANTHE. In 1978, Penny was the recipient of an award for outstanding work behind the scenes. It is now an annual award and it affectionately bears her name, "The Penny Award." Penny is a believer in what the Actorsingers offers the Nashua community. She and her husband, Albin, are life members and have 3 grown former Jr. Actorsingers.

ASSISTANT PRODUCTION COORDINATOR. MARC A. CORMIER

WEST SIDE STORY was Marc's first show with the Actorsingers. He worked backstage as a crew member for that production and for the two that followed, THE MUSIC MAN and MACK AND MABEL. In PETER PAN, Marc made his on-stage debut as one of Capt. Hook's pirates, then was in the chorus of GREASE and played Ching in our last show, ANYTHING GOES. Marc, his wife Cheryl, and their children live in Salem and are active Actorsingers.

ASSISTANT STAGE MANAGERS BOB LOVERING SHIRLEY COUTU

Bob has been an Assistant Stage Manager for several Actorsingers shows, often working with his wife, Kathy, when she has been Stage Manager. For each of our shows since THE WIZ, Bob has muscled loads of sets, equipment, props and crew members. He was also responsible for Peter Pan's flight patterns in our 1988 production. Bob works for the town of Merrimack. He and Kathy have 2 daughters, 2 year old Emily and 5 month old Madeline.

Shirley has revealed another of her talents in OKLAHOMA. Until now, we thought she was only capable of costume design, chairing audition boards, heading subscription committees and holding a seat on our Board of Directors! For such responsibilities, Shirley received our latest Penny Award. For this show, Shirley is Props Mistress as well as assisting our Stage Manager. She is, incidentally, married to the Director of this production.

But it is his work on-stage that is known best by our audiences. Numbered among Ted's roles here; Tony in WEST SIDE STORY, Doody in GREASE and the Tinman in THE WIZ. 




