

Director's Note

In 1999, during a time when teen films were everywhere, "Cruel Intentions" released, and though it tackles the familiar tropes of a teen movie, it took risks and went outside the box of what was typically standard. I, at the time, was barely old enough to see it on DVD a few years after its release. The "R" rating, exploring themes of sexual awakenings, taboo relationships, and melodrama played to an older audience, despite the characters all being in their teens.

"Cruel Intentions: The '90s Musical" is a love letter to the film. Script-wise, it's almost page-for-page, so those familiar with the movie will hear all the lines and see all the moments they've come to recognize. But as a musical, it's traditionally done with a small cast of approximately 9 to 12. The creative team chose to include an ensemble. Adding that to the core characters brought this cast to 20.

We really dove into each characters' motivations, their desires, their interpersonal relationships, and how their choices impact themselves and those around them. Also, our ensemble created unique characters that, through their inclusion in Sebastian's journal entries, the unique choreography, and amazing vocal direction, enhance these familiar moments to bring something new without changing the story. Across the board, this cast delivers, with each character being engaging and interesting, whether it's the awkwardness and comedic moments of Cecile and her sexual awakening, the tension between Sebastian and Kathryn, and the experience of first real love with Annette. This also helps us see the change that these characters go through as a result of their choices.

That theme of change is one that's important and personal to me, not just as a first-time director, but as someone who has experienced constant change much like all of us have for the past three years. Whether by choice or by circumstance, it comes for all of us and we either accept it, regardless of the outcome, or push against it as much as we can, and these characters' struggles and successes speak to that in many subtle and not-so-subtle ways.

Just as the movie on which it's based, this show retains its familiar story while providing a more exciting and sometimes even more provocative presentation. Whether you grew up in the '90s, experienced it as an adult, or even consider the '90s to be "retro", you're likely to see something of yourself or someone you know in these characters, and I can't thank this cast and creative team enough for their incredible work bringing it to life. Thank you all for coming, and please enjoy the show.
